"Holy Cow. This was amazing. I got a great dress that makes me feel so good about myself. Even my flaws. I'm amazing, you're amazing. Thank you."

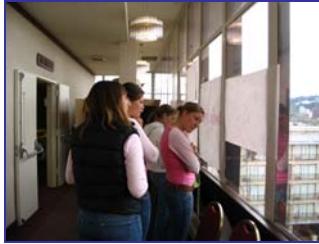
"Thank you for making my prom a dream come true! I feel like a princess. It was well worth the effort you put into this to make so many girls happy! Keep up the good work."

A Special Prom Dress Donation

We have heard so many wonderful stories from girls whose lives we've touched. But, there is one special story from a woman who made the very difficult decision to donate her prom dress. Here's the note she enclosed with the dress:

"Thanks for your work collecting prom dresses. This is such a great program. My prom was in 1985 and I have hung on to my beloved dress through over 10 moves - though never worn it again. My family was going through particularly difficult financial time when I was in high school and I never went to school dances. I went to school with some of the richest kids in the country but

always got my clothes at thrift stores - and they never had formals or party dresses. My dearest guy friend invited me to senior prom. His family had lots of money and he had his tux made for him. After several depressing shopping trips with my mom, I saw this dress hanging in the window of an antique store. I assumed it would never fit, would be too expensive and/or would show my chicken pox scar. Amazingly, this hand-made California designer dress from the 1950's was priced within my small budget, fit me perfectly, and covered the scar I was so embarrassed about. This elegant, full-length dress was "retro" even in 1985, but it was the absolute hit of the prom (and my prom pictures don't look as silly as the girls' who wore the enormous shoulder pads that were the trendy thing then). I have never owned another piece of clothing so special. I hope it helps fulfill another girl's prom dreams. Thanks again for starting this great program."
